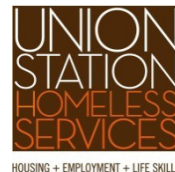

NEW OPPORTUNITIES

KITCHEN LEAD VOLUNTEER – evening opportunity

Hours: Evenings once a week - 6:00pm-9:00pm (Adult Center); or 5:00-8:00pm (Family Center)

This is a great opportunity for volunteers with strong customer service and leadership skills and for those interested in **volunteering in the evening**. Kitchen Lead volunteers will act as liaison for Adopt-a-Meal groups who come in every night to cook, serve and clean-up. They will also assist the Resident Advisor on evenings without a group. Kitchen Leads will provide information on safe food handling, how to use the dishwashing system, how to track meal counts, etc. **A two-hour training is required and a 6-month commitment. Anyone interested should email volunteer@unionstationhs.org. Anticipated start date for the program is summer 2017.**

HOLLY STREET HOUSING VOLUNTEER

Hours: flexible during work days (Monday-Friday 9am-12pm)

A volunteer is requested to assist the staff with answering the door and providing information to individuals seeking immediate resources. Sign up to assist the office once a week for a 6-month commitment. You will be trained by Holly Street staff before starting.

INDIVIDUAL VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

ADULT CENTER FRONT DESK VOLUNTEER

Mondays, Thursdays or Fridays 11:30am-2pm

A volunteer is needed to assist the Security & Care Coordinator team at the reception desk in the dining hall. Duties include answering the phones, greeting visitors, and helping with mail service. Volunteer should be confident and friendly, helpful and positive with a pleasant phone voice and professional manner. Minimum age is 18 years old. Once a week opportunity for a 6-month commitment.

ADULT CENTER ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANCE

Hours: flexible during work days (Monday-Friday 9am-5pm)

The Adult Center's Program Services Coordinator is looking for volunteer(s) to scan client confidential documents once or more a week. The hours are flexible during work days, work hours.

ADULT CENTER DORM ASSISTANT

Hours: flexible during work days (Monday-Friday 9am-5pm)

Individuals needed to assist staff by taking requests from residents during the day and assisting them as needed. They may need assistance with the elevator, with directions or bus token, with paperwork, etc. The ideal candidate is someone with human service experience or is attending school studying social work or related field.

ADULT CENTER KITCHEN VOLUNTEERS

Positions are available every day of the week:

Breakfast Shift 7:00-9:30am; Lunch Shift 10:30am-2:00pm; or Kitchen Clean & Prep 1:00-4:00pm.

Volunteers assist the kitchen staff in prepping, cooking, serving and cleaning during a meal shift. Age requirements: must be at least 13 years old (ages 13-15 require an adult chaperon). Lifting may be required (up to 20 lbs.). Hairnets, aprons and gloves are provided. **Dress code: pants, t-shirts and closed-toe shoes.**

GROUP VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

ADOPT-A-MEAL

Groups support the meal program and residents at our Adult Center or Family Center shelters by sponsoring a meal. Groups build a menu based on the guidelines, purchase, prepare and provide hot meals for the residents. For regular Adopt-a-Meal Groups the commitment is for a once-a-month meal for 12 months. SACK LUNCH

This important program provides a complete lunch for the school-aged children as well as the working parents at the Family Center. The lunches are also used for any adult attending our programs. Groups purchase and prepare approximately 50 sack lunches, once a month for 12 months or can fill in an occasional open day. **[CLICK HERE](#) for the Sack Lunch program details.**

ADOPT-AN-ITEM

The Adopt-An-Item program provides our main kitchen with much needed supplies as they serve breakfast and lunch to community members in need throughout the year. Groups purchase one or more items from the Adopt-an-Item list, once a month for 12 months. WELCOME HOME KIT BASKETS

Help a family or individual as they move into permanent housing and escape homelessness. A Welcome Kit Basket assists with meeting the basic needs when moving into a new home or apartment.
